Inhabited by native peoples for thousands of years,


France ceded the territory to England in 1763

From 1777 until until 1861 (civil war) Vermont was free. Slaves passed for a hundred years or more up through to the region now Canada. For eighty four years, Vermont, or the region now known as, served as a conduit for free men and women. From 1777 -1791 (15 years) Vermont is sovereign; one of the earliest and continuous democracies.

1791 Vermont joined the Union as the first non-colony state.

Fullum was created by a New Hampshire grant in 1753. The name Dummerston was adopted very early, but Fullum was not officially changed to Dummerston until 1937.
