Primarily press.js is an exercise in extending the capabilities of the native browser via a computational hierarchy of interactions between browser type (specific agents) and a combinational frequency method, such as analytic tracking, security verification, and inter page functions, such as simple knowing the url that is currently in the browser,

What does it mean to be future proof or hade degrade support for older systems?

The goal is not to make a comprehensive or total system the goal is to use a durable, usable/ useful, functional, and expandable programme.
